The wisdom of Proverbs teaches us to "train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6, KJV). Each of our five confirmands has been "raised up" by our church family since their biological family brought them into the flock through the Sacrament of Baptism when they were but infants. In the Rite of Confirmation, these young members will publically affirm their profession of faith in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and will publically and personally reaffirm the baptismal covenant their parents made for them many years ago.

Luke's Gospel account tells us "People were...bringing babies to Jesus for him to place his hands on them. When the disciples saw this, they rebuked them. But Jesus called the children to him and said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it."" (Luke 18:15-17, NIV).

While some in Christianity are critical of infant baptism, the reality is, Jesus very clearly demands that we should not hinder the little children from coming to Him. He further reminds us that His Kingdom, in fact, belongs to them and we need to learn from them, that if we too wish to receive Him and His Kingdom, we must do so "like a little child".

What a blessing that our five confirmands have grown up in Christian families that took heed of the Holy Spirit's call on them to dedicate their children to the Kingdom of God through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism and what a blessing that we get to see the Truth of Scripture manifest as these youngsters who have been "trained up" have indeed "not departed" but instead will step forward and declare of their own volition a renunciation of Satan and his evil, and acceptance of Christ and all His mercy, grace, and blessings, not the least of which being the blessing of salvation through Him.

Please continue to pray for our youth, as they are not only the future of our world, but they are the future of Christ's Church in this world.

### **REMEMBERING MR. EARL ITTMANN**


(JANUAR 21, 1923 - MAY 16, 2017)

# EXTRA SPECIAL—BRENNEN HIGGINBOTHAM

Good Shepherd is blessed with so many extra special members who go the extra mile for church and this month, we begin a new feature of shining the spotlight on one such member. Our first Extra Special Spotlight is being shined on 18 year old Brennen Higginbotham.

Brennen is an active member of our church who keeps things moving every Thursday and Sunday in our media booth. He just graduated from Haynes Academy where he played football, bowled, and managed his academics so well, that he has been offered a full scholarship to attend Avila University in Kansas City, MO this fall, where he'll also play football as he double majors in History and Secondary Education and minors in Religious Studies.



In five years, Brennen sees himself back in New Orleans, teaching high school and attending seminary part time as he continues to discern a call to Christian ministry. This should come as no surprise to Good Shepherd, as he has been an active participant in our Youth Ministry and has even preached his own, original sermons from time to time in our pulpit. In fact, he is scheduled to preach twice this summer. On Thursday, June 8, he'll preach a message entitled "Beat the Heat" at our Midweek Holy Eucharist and on Sunday, August 6, we'll hold our annual Youth Sunday and Brennen, for the third year in the row, will bring the Youth Sunday message. This year is "bittersweet" as Brennen explains "I'll be leaving the church parking lot on Sunday after preaching the youth service and driving off to college."

Brennen states that moving out of New Orleans comes with the upside of a much cooler climate, but he admits he's uncertain about what do to about missing New Orleans food and his Good Shepherd church family. While he knows virtually no one at his new school, he is excited about making new Christian friends. Avila University is a private, Catholic college. He looks forward to continuing to foster his leadership skills at his new school. At Haynes Academy, one of his leadership duties on the football team was to lead a prayer and offer a motivating devotional to the team before each game. He explains that he was able to minister to his teammates by talking to them about "the cornerstone the builders rejected" and that, as a team, they didn't have to accept the identity that the local newspaper depicted of them. His junior year team was picked by the local press to go winless and that team ended up with an 8-2 record, including the chance to host a play off game.

We know the Lord has big plans for Brennen and all of us at Good Shepherd hold him in prayer as he prepares for the next chapter of his life!

## **VISION: 2020**

Earlier in the year meetings were held for the congregation to generate ideas they would like to see explored in order to make improvements to our church. There are three areas we would like to undertake in the very near future.

<u>Beautification of the exterior</u>. This involves cleaning the exterior of the siding, replacing the fascia and soffit along with the underling wood that is rotten on the gable ends. Updating the shrubs and planting. Some plants have been added in



the area between the two buildings and some of the dead sections of azaleas have been removed.

- <u>Redesigning the choir room into a chapel for a smaller worship experience</u>. The choir would still use the room for before Sunday worship practice and for children's choir practice. The redesign would involve improved lighting, adding a worship table/altar, reconfiguring current robe and file storage, and relocating some of the items that are stored in that space.
- Adding a Prayer garden in the southwest corner of the property. A small area with planting, seating, and possibly a small fountain.


