Looking ahead to August, I'm excited to announce that Good Shepherd will be hosting a three session health education workshop entitled "Beneath the Weight." The sessions will be held on three consecutive Saturdays, August 12, 19, and 26, from 10:30 AM until 1:00 PM. The "Beneath the Weight" workshop aims to educate participants in the relationship between psychological mindfulness and healthy eating. Over the course of the three Saturday sessions, participants will learn about the relationship between stress and overeating; how better to manage stress; the power of changing the way our mind influences our food choices; and so much more. This program, offered by SelfCare Health Initiatives, is absolutely free and contains no lectures, no diets, no exercise, and no products for sale. In the coming weeks, we'll have more information available about how to sign up for this life changing, three workshop program.

And one final upcoming summer event I want you to know about will take place on Saturday, July 15. Good Shepherd will be holding an American Heart Association HeartSaver CPR & AED training. There is no cost to attend this training, but spots are limited. You may sign up using the sheet on the bulletin board in the narthex. Class will begin at 9:30 AM and should conclude by 12:30 PM. Our instructor is a firefighter/EMT who is a certified instructor for the American Heart Association.

This isn't the end, but merely the beginning of all that is happening at church this summer. Keep your eyes and ears open for so many other exciting activities including an ice cream social after our 10:00 AM worship service on July 23, our celebration of Christmas in July on Sunday, July 30, and a very special event on August 21, when Good Shepherd is partnering with God to offer a solar eclipse! VISION 2020 UPDATE

Good Shepherd's Vision 2020 project is our medium range wish list of things that we'd like to see happen in the next three years (i.e, by the year 2020). This list includes items that individuals have suggested to improve our church's physical appearance as well as areas that are identified as needing improvement or maintenance. We're starting to see some progress but there is still much to do. The year 2020 sounds like a long way away but the years go by quick. Here's a short list. As you read it, ask yourself "Is that something I may be able to assist with?"

- <u>Cleaning and removing mildew from siding and fascia on buildings</u>. This will be completed by the end of July.
- <u>Repairing and repainting trim fascia and soffit on rear of sanctuary building</u>. Replacing missing aluminum fascia and vinyl soffit on front of sanctuary. This will most likely be done by a contractor and we are currently looking to get quotes.
- Landscape improvements. Many of our shrubs are old and overgrown. We need help and ideas on ways to improve. Many bushes need to be removed and replaced. I have cut back the azaleas on front of the sanctuary. Carrie Mains has added small plants in the area between the two buildings. There is a lot more that needs to happen.
- Improved signage. We have been using various banners that are starting to look old and tired. We would like to replace them with a two sided, 4 line changeable letter sign that we can add messages to, so that we can highlight events to the traffic that passes our building. We have started to look at prices to accomplish this.
- <u>Redesigning the choir room into a chapel for a smaller worship experience</u>. The redesign would involve improved lighting adding a worship table, improving robe and file storage and relocating some of the items that are storage. I am preparing drawings in the next month as to what we want to do and they will be posted for comments and suggestions before changes are made.
- Adding a prayer garden in the southwest corner of the property. A small area with planting, seating and possible a small fountain. I am currently working on a design. I am gathering information on this and will welcome any help available on the design.

We need help to accomplish these improvements and it is not all physical labor. We need help getting quotes and sharing ideas. I think we will need fund raisers to accomplish some of the more costly items that will need help from the entire congregation.

EXTRA SPECIAL—MEL AUCOIN

We continue our monthly feature of shining a spotlight on some of our many EXTRA SPECIAL members at Good Shepherd—those who go the extra mile in their service to Christ and His Church.

This month, we turn the volunteer spotlight on Melvin Aucoin. Mel and his wife Margaret have been members of Good Shepherd for over two decades, coming to us from St. Matthew's UCC in New Orleans. While Mel is a lifelong member of the denomination, when he met and married Margaret, she was a



Roman Catholic and shortly after, she ended up joining Mel on his Evangelical and Reformed Christian faith journey. Following the birth of their two children, Mel and Margaret found that the demographics at St. Matthew's church were shifting in such a way that little was available in terms of children's Christian Education. They soon discovered Good Shepherd and have never looked back.

Since joining Good Shepherd, Mel has served our church in just about every capacity imaginable, including President of the Church Council. Currently he serves as Vice President and also spends his time as our Buildings and Grounds Manager. You could call him Sexton, Custodial Engineer, Technology Guru, and Chief Mechanic of Anything Mechanical, and you would still only barely touch the surface of all that Mel does for Good Shepherd, which also include choir member, New Orleans Association delegate, and electronics/technology manager.

With a reflective tone, Mel recalls with fondness his days at St. Matthew when he was a Sunday School teacher for teens, a position that eventually led to he and Margaret to start a Youth Group. He's also quick to add with a chuckle, "but that was a long time ago." When asked what he believes his true calling to Christ's Church is, without hesitation Mel will tell you "Pretty much taking care of the church property. Somebody's got to do it. I don't think I'm particularly gifted in teaching or preaching, that's for sure, but property maintenance, I would say, is my calling."

Mel may not consider himself called to preach, but he's no stranger to it either. One Thursday evening in 2016, Pastor Randy, at the very last minute, was unable to make it to church for Midweek Service. Like a man born to witness to the Gospel, Mel stepped up and filled in with an inspiring message for those in attendance. E

Mel also has Christian teaching in his blood. His grandmother taught kindergarten Sunday School for nearly seven decades at St. Matthew. In her younger days, Mel says she would walk from Brooklyn Avenue in Jefferson all the way up to St. Matthew's Evangelical and Reformed Church on Carrolton Avenue, always determined to arrive at least thirty minutes early to prepare herself for her "scholars" as she affectionately referred to her young students. "She was my Sunday School teacher" says Mel, "and in fact, she taught several people who are now a part of Good Shepherd. She taught all the way up until the week before her death."

Mel's deep love for Good Shepherd is rooted in "the Spirit. The Christian Spirit is clearly evident at Good Shepherd!" And when asked about what he believes to be one of the most pressing issues facing the Christian faith, Mel pulls no punches and speaks with a knowledge level and authority most typically observed in a seminarian professor when he states "The lack of fundamentals in churches today is a problem. So much of Christianity has become about personal feelings and the modern church has gotten away from basic fundamentals of the faith--what it means to be a Christian and the gift of salvation that comes to us through Jesus Christ."

Council Member, Sexton, Buildings Manager, Custodial Engineer, Choir Member, Technology Guru, Chief Mechanic, and only the Lord knows how many other titles are appropriate for this month's spotlight member, but one thing for sure is, Good Shepherd is blessed to have Mel Aucoin as a member. His unselfish sharing of time and talent is stands emblematic of what it means to be a member and leader in a church!


I hear Sharon say how much she appreciates those members who have jumped in to see that all is going well while she is unable to be there. She asked me to thank them for her. "Thank you!"
