FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

AN EASTER EUCHARIST—CELEBRATING THANKSGIVING IN THE SPRING

Most people probably think of the earthly season of Fall when they think of Thanksgiving. But as Christians, the Easter Season in Spring is also a time of GREAT THANKSGIVING.

The word "Eucharist" is most commonly used in church to refer to the Sacrament of Holy Communion, yet few Christians know that the real meaning of the word is *thanksgiving*. We get the word *Eucharist* from the Greek noun *eucharistia* which literally translates to mean *thanksgiving*.

Most Christians are probably familiar with the part of the Eucharistic Liturgy that includes the words:

The Lord be with you. And also with you. Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give God thanks and praise.

That responsive exchange between the minister and the congregation is often called "The Eucharistic Prayer" or "The Great Thanksgiving".

As we enter into the earthly season of Spring and into the Liturgical Season of Easter, let us remain mindful of all that we have to be thankful for. In fact, I believe we should look upon this season with the same sort of fondness and gratitude that we look upon turkey, stuffing, apple pie and football games in the Fall.

As the penitential season of Lent comes to a close, Easter gives us an opportunity to enter into a time of joyous celebration. We celebrate that by the finished work of the Cross at Calvary and in a perfect victory over the grave, our Lord conquered sin and death once and for all for those who place their faith and trust in Him. We remember and celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and we are thankful for the promise of new life in Him!

It is no coincidence that the universal Christian church celebrates Easter in the Spring. The evidence of new life abounds this time of year all through nature. You need only look and you will easily find evidence of blossoming trees, blooming flowers, baby birds chirping and brown lawns turning green again. Let these worldly sights serve as reminders to you to offer thanks to God for all the gifts of rebirth you have experienced in your life.

As I write this, I think about Good Shepherd Church and how much we have to be thankful for this Easter. 
