### FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

#### MID-TERM REPORT CARD

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (Matthew 6:21)

Each Fall, Good Shepherd Church holds a time of stewardship. During that season of time, we prayerfully consider our personal offerings to the local church in her mission to serve our community. This is the financial lifeblood of any local church. Believe it or not, by the time we are in the midst of Spring (as we are now), we are at the halfway point of the church year and that's a good time for us to look at the financial fruits of our stewardship.

This Spring, I think it is fair to say the news is mixed. There is some really good news and there is some less than good news. I think we should celebrate the good news and prayerfully and speedily turn our attention to simply fixing the less than good news. Allow me to review both sets of news with you.

#### GOOD NEWS ON FINANCES

In November 2017, Good Shepherd Church collected pledge cards and we are delighted to report that the number of pledge cards turned in on stewardship Sunday had reached a maximum level of participation not seen in well over a decade. That is <u>very</u> good news!

In December 2017, Good Shepherd's pastoral and lay leadership completed a review of premiums from a variety of different insurance companies. Our previous insurer, United Insurance Board, was no longer an option for our insurance needs because of our disaffiliation from our former denomination, and the study of alternatives yielded our church a significant annual savings. For comparison's sake, in 2016, our premiums with the United Insurance Board totaled \$23,510, while our premiums in 2018 with our new carrier total \$13,200. That is very good news!

In January 2018, Good Shepherd's surplus funds in our operational account were such that the Church Council voted to pay off the remainder of our balance for our post-Katrina SBA load. That loan, from over 12 years ago, was worth over \$330,000 and was down to just above \$30,000 when we completely retired it in January 2018. That is <u>very</u> good news!

### Not So Good News

As of the end of the first quarter of the year 2018, our budget was approximately \$6,000 below projected intake for the year and our operational funds are significantly lower than they were one year ago for the same timeframe. That's <u>not</u> very good news, but it is also not without explanation. Let's review.

The complete and total retirement of the SBA loan in January 2018 saved us over \$1,000 per month in monthly payments over the next three years, but it contributed to a significant diminishing of our savings account.

In the beginning of 2018, Good Shepherd Church opted to pay the entire annual premium with our new insurance carrier in order to avoid finance charges associated with paying quarterly. Like the loan payoff, this also places a larger burden on our savings during the first part of the calendar year.

Compared to the 1st quarter of 2017, the 2018 1st quarter accounts for several deaths over the course of 2017 and early 2018 that significantly and permanently impact our monthly plate income.

While the vast majority of our members have kept up with or surpassed their pledged giving, there are often times when a few fall behind, either unintentionally or because personal financial issues have impacted them.

#### WHAT'S BEING DONE AND HOW YOU CAN HELP

It is hard to imagine that anyone who has read this far would not be moved to try to help in any manner in which they could. That is one of the beauties and strengths of Good Shepherd Church. Our church is nowhere close to the near financial collapse it encountered in the Summer of 2014, when our bank account slipped to a mere five digit amount before key members of Council leadership chose to share this information with the entire congregation. Admirably, in 2014, when made aware of the dire financial situation, the congregation stepped up to the plate and did what needed to be done to correct problem. I have no doubt that by simply letting our church family know now that our finances are not as healthy today as they were in the first quarter of 2017, that all will do whatever they are capable of doing to help us correct the direction of our finances well in advance in order to avert another unnecessary and painful financial crisis.

There are a number of things each of us can do to help.

Pray for Good Shepherd Church and for her finances. While you are at it, pray for your own finances and ask the Lord to guide you in any ways He sees fit.

If you are behind in your giving, do all in your power to get caught up.

- If you are able, consider giving a little extra each time you are able. I promise you, the Lord will bless you for it.
- Actively participate in all of our fundraising efforts. Just don't attend our fundraisers, but help us by advance-selling tickets to your friends, family, and neighbors. Likewise, just don't purchase a few raffle tickets, but take tickets home with you to sell to your friends, family, and neighbors.
- Actively seek and invite new people to be a part of our church. Every time our family of faith grows, our giving income grows too as new members gratefully acknowledge their appreciation for the ministry of beautiful church.

There are several cities named after me, and there is even a street near the church named after me. No, I don't live there. I live at Good Shepherd. That's why I know so much about all that is happening at the church.


