#### FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY—TO THE CROSS

As we journey through the forty days of Lent, we journey toward the Cross at Calvary. It is only through the horror of the Cross that we can reach the beauty of the Resurrection. It may seem a silly question, but allow me to ask it anyway. Who makes the beauty of the Resurrection possible? Christ Jesus of course—by the shedding of his blood and laying down his life on the Cross.

In Matthew 16, Jesus asks his disciples "Who do people say that I am?" (v.13) before he asks an even more pointed and important question: "Who do YOU say that I am?" (v.15). That second question is of utmost importance to our Christian faith. If you cannot answer it like Peter (v.16) "You are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God" then I would encourage you to consider who Jesus tells us he is.

In John's gospel account, Jesus gives us the so-called "Seven I Ams" to reveal to us who he is. As we continue through the latter part of Lent, en route to the death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord, I invite you to meditate on these "I Am" statements of Christ, and with a heart of gratitude, giving thanks to God for each.

I am the Bread of Life (John 6:35) – Thank you, Lord, for your body and blood offered for me.

I am the Light of the World (John 8:12) – Thank you, Lord, that I need never walk in darkness.

I am the Gate (John 10:7) – Thank you, Lord, that through you I may enter into salvation.

I am the Good Shepherd (John 10:11) – Thank you, Lord, for laying down your life for mine.

I am the Resurrection and the Life (John 11:25) - Thank you, Lord, for the gift of eternal life.

I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life (John 14:6) - Thank you, Lord, for making a way for me to reach the Father.

I am the Vine (John 15:5) - Thank you, Lord, that I can do all things through you.

Until next month, let your light shine!

### CHURCH GROUNDS AND BUILDINGS UPDATES

Spring is a time for renewal and beautification. With that in mind we are making changes around the Good Shepherd's campus. Here is a list of the projects on tap:

- Earlier this year the playground equipment "monkey bars" was removed and the remaining swings will be pressure washed and cleaned up.
- A contract with Roofing Solutions (Todd Mondello's employer) for \$1750 was released to repair the front and rear of the Sanctuary gable ends. There was much rot especially in the rear of the building and council decided the time had come to repair. The schedule is for the work to be done on the week of March 25th
- J&W Tree Service is scheduled to remove the tree and grind down the stump for a cost of \$1300. This is the tree on the west side of the Sanctuary. The tree is showing signs of dying and the branches are above the electrical service. This should happen about the first week in April.
- After these are done we will receive a load of sand to fill in areas of subsidence and to elevate the side yard where we are installing a memorial prayer garden. This will be funded entirely on memorial giving gifts we have received. We plan a small concrete area with two benches. Planting will be installed with some small trees and statues. The design is coming together and the area should be complete by summer.
- The Men's Club is still actively pursuing the purchase of a permanent electronic sign. We have raised about \$3000 which is a little less than half of what we will need to move forward. In the meantime a replacement banner has been purchased for our service times and some minimum repairs made to our current sign to give us a more presentable appearance on the street.

We will be looking for help as always with either physical labor or finances to make these repairs/improvements a reality. Our outward appearance to our neighbors is important for our future growth!

In late February we were contacted by the production company filming *NCIS* New Orleans needing a commissary with full catering for a location shoot on Kent Ave. They rented the fellowship hall and two of the side rooms for makeup stations on February 26 and 27<sup>th</sup>. The first day had close to 200 actors and support people and the second day about half that number. The church was able to earn \$1600 (\$800/day) and we were still able to accommodate volleyball on the evening between the two days. I am reporting this not to brag, but to point out that close to 20% of our budget is from various rentals throughout the year. If any of our members or friends have need of meeting or party space please see the Pastor or myself. We will try our best to accommodate. The GSC price list is posted on the bulletin board church's narthex toward the fellowship hall side.

Our very own sheep at Good Shepherd have been very busy accomplishing great things!


-Sydney Mondello made the honor roll once again as a 3rd grader at St. Rita.

We are so proud of all of our youth at Good Shepherd!!






The last date to sign up and/or turn in your payment to purchase the Easter Lilies will be Sunday, April 7, 2019.
