FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

ARE YOU (REALLY) A CHURCH MEMBER?

Think about this question: "What does it mean to be a church member?" Realize I did not ask "What does it mean to be a Christian?" nor "What does it mean to have been baptized or confirmed?"

While it may "technically" be possible to be a baptized and confirmed Christian without being a member of a local church, it would seem that this would require some very specific and extraordinary circumstances. It would also seem that it would be very hard to envision these circumstances lasting for more than just a very temporary moment in time.

Likewise, it is hard to imagine that declaring oneself as a member of a church yet not being an active and regular worshiper at the church and/or not being a regular supporter of the church, would not disallow someone's truthful claim to church membership.

In a 2016 Pew Research Institute study, it was revealed that only 51% of Americans who consider themselves Christians actually go to church with any degree of regularity. To add some further context to this statistic, "regularity" was defined in this survey as ranging from "several times a week" all the way down to only "once a month."

Forget for a moment what the Pew data may reveal. Try also to forget for a moment what you personally believe about the relationship between church attendance and actually being a Christian. Let me ask you this question: "Do you know what God actually says about being a Christian and practicing that faith?" I mean... DO YOU REALLY KNOW? Can you cite chapter and verse?

On June 9, 2019, we will commemorate the 50th Day After Easter—a holy day in the Christian Church known as Pentecost. In the Book of Acts, this day of Pentecost marks the "birthday" of the Christian Church.

Beginning on Pentecost Sunday, I will be offering a six part teaching series on the Biblical understanding of church membership. My Sunday sermons will be loosely based on the devotional book "I Am a Church Member" authored by Thom S. Rainer. Each week, we will examine God's Holy Word and what it has to say about truly being a church member and I will give an opportunity for each person attending worship to recommit themselves to being a member of the Body of Christ by pledging to recommit themselves to being "a church member."

Topics will include:

- 1. I Will Be a Functioning Church Member (June 9, 2019)
- 2. I Will Be a Unifying Church Member (June 16, 2019)
- 3. I Will Not Let My Church Be About My Preferences and Desires (June 23, 2019)
- 4. I Will Pray for My Church Leaders (July 7, 2019)
- 5. I Will Lead My Family to Be Healthy Church Members (July 14, 2019)
- 6. I Will Treasure Church Membership as a Gift (July 21, 2019)

You might have noticed that it will take seven full weeks to get through the six sessions. This is due to the fact that I will not preach on Sunday June 30. As is our tradition, we will continue with our Good Shepherd Church Fifth Sunday Celebration. In keeping with this fifth Sunday of the month tradition, June 30 will primarily feature music during our morning worship service.

As I conclude this month's column, let me offer a spoiler alert or two... church membership really matters. It doesn't "have privileges" but rather IT IS a privilege. You can never fully be who God would have you be until you submit to Him, and you cannot submit to Him if you do not obey Him, and He says "You shall have no other gods before me" (Exodus 20:3). Jesus said it this way, "You shall love the Lord with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind. This if the first and greatest commandment" (Matthew 22:37-38).

Are you truly a church member? Allow me to invite you to church each Sunday for this summer teaching series. I pray that you'll accept the invitation and that you will declare by both your words and your actions "I am a church member."


means to a director. I can honestly say that I have never worked with a more dedicated group of singers. They are truly a blessing to me and to the congregation.

Some Figures and Facts for Father's Day

The U.S. Census Bureau reports that there are over 72 million fathers in the United States.

Many credit Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, with starting Father's Day. She had the idea for the holiday after hearing a sermon preached on Mother's Day while she was attending church with her father. Dodd was moved to try to get the holiday started in order to honor fathers like her own, William Jackson Smart, a Civil War veteran who raised six children as a single dad after his wife died during childbirth.



In the U.S., the first celebration of Father's Day took place in Spokane, Washington in 1910. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge expressed public support for the holiday but it was not officially declared a U.S. holiday until President Lyndon B. Johnson signed an official proclamation declaring that the third Sunday of June would be set aside and celebrated as Father's Day. In 1972, President Richard Nixon signed the holiday into law.

Hallmark cites Father's Day as the fourth largest card sending holiday with over 72 million cards sent for the occasion. (If you are curious, number 3 is Mother's Day, number 2 is Saint Valentine's Day, and number 1 is Christmas!)

This year, Father's Day will be celebrated on Sunday, June 16.

BUILDING PROJECTS AROUND OUR PROPERTY

PRAYER GARDEN PROGRESS

Now that the area is filled and the old tree is down the prayer garden in slowly coming together. Much thanks to Irving and Marcel Lacrouts and Joe Deibel for their help in moving sand. We were also able to fill several subsidence area around the property. Margaret and I have been working on a final planting design. Our goal is to provide a quiet peaceful area for prayer and reflection with planting requiring low maintenance. Our next steps are as follows:

- To remove existing old fence posts from chain link fence.
- To stain the existing swing set.
- Contract to have concrete walkway formed and poured.
- Purchase and install 3 small benches and sealed concrete praying Jesus as center piece.
- To install plants/ bushes/ small trees. Plantings from ground cover to no taller than 8ft.
- Install dedication plaques.

KITCHEN REMODEL

During the Summer I have plans to replace the counter top in the fellowship hall kitchen. The plywood that was built by the work campers years ago has become rotted. The plan is to install a new pre-made Formica counter top and rebuild the 72" of cabinet fronts below. My goal is to have this project complete by the end of July.

CARE TO READ AHEAD?

Do you remember in school that your teachers used to say something about coming to class prepared? Those comments probably wend something like this: "Don't come to class unprepared! The material will be much more enjoyable and much more easily learned if you simply read in advance of the class."

The lectionary readings for Pentecost Sunday includes Acts 2:1-11, Psalm 104, 1 Corinthians 12:4-14, and John 20:19-23 (with an option for the minister to instead use John14:8-17).

If the only time you're hearing Holy Scripture is during that five to tens minutes on Sunday when the Liturgy of the Word is presented in advance of the sermon, then you're not getting your recommended daily allowance of God's Word! Read your Bible!

If you don't own a Bible but would like to, see Rev. Graf and let him know. He'll make sure you get one—no questions asked (and no one else needs to know you asked).

LOAN US YOUR VOICE!

Liturgy. If you look it up in the dictionary, you'll probably see a definition such as "The term "liturgy" has often been said to mean "a form or formulary for public worship in Christianity".

This English word "liturgy" comes to us from the Greek *leitourgia* which loosely translates to mean "work of the people" and "work for the people". What an interesting use of the preposition "of" and "for".

As much as the liturgy or "public worship" is the work of the people, that means, despite having an ordained minister leading worship, the people still have work to do (e.g., praying the prescribed prayers, responding to prayers, singing hymns, faithfully receiving the Sacraments, etc.). But if it's also work for the people, then that assures that God is in the midst of our public worship! In the midst of our worship, He is with and for us!

Just as some are called to be clergy, and some are called to be choir members, some are also called to be lectors. What's a lector? That the person who reads some of the Scriptures during the part of worship called the Liturgy of the Word—the part of worship where Scripture is read, heard, and a message proclaimed.

If you feel called to be a lector, please let Rev. Graf know so that you can use your gift to the glory of God! He would be happy to have you reading on a Sunday morning!


