FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

I AM A CHURCH MEMBER

This summer, I have enjoyed presenting the six part sermon series entitled "I Am a Church Member" based Dr. Thom Rainer's devotional by the same title.

I will use this month's column to offer a brief review of each of the six points of the series. It is my prayer that you have come away from this series understanding the reality that church membership is a precious gift from God. If you missed a week, I would encourage you to go to our website to listen to any part of the series or to purchase a copy of the book which is available on Amazon for about \$6. It is well worth the minimal cost investment.

<u>Pledge 1</u>: *I will be a functioning church member.* Being a member of the Body of Christ can only be realized when one is *functioning* as a member. This means that attendance at church is not optional; nor is giving. Functioning members give, serve, minister, evangelize, and seek to be a blessing to others.

<u>Pledge 2</u>: I will be a unifying church member. I understand that there are no perfect churches, perfect pastors, or perfect members, but I strive, with the help of God, to be a unifier in the local church. I will not seek to have things my way, but rather will work for the betterment of the church.

<u>Pledge 3</u>: I will not let my church be about my preferences and desires. I will not fall into the trap of being self-serving in my church. I am a member to serve others and to serve Christ. I can and will deal with inconveniences and matters that just aren't my preference or my style, because that is what healthy members of a local church do.

<u>Pledge 4</u>: **I will pray for my church leaders.** I realize that my pastor's work is seemingly neverending. I will commit to pray for him daily. I will also pray for his family as well as those in our local church who are called to be leaders. I will pray that God will grant to my pastor and our church leaders, wisdom and strength to do all that God is calling them to do.

Pledge 5: I will lead my family to be healthy church members. I will join with my believing family members to pray for our church regularly. For those members of my family that are not active, functioning members of the church, I will also pray. I will pray that their hearts will be open to the Holy Spirit moving in their lives and I will pray that they will come to be worshippers in Christ's Holy Church. I will pray that I will fall deeper and deeper in love with the local church that God has placed me in and that my affection for that church will be seen by my family and result in my family joining me as a part of the Good Shepherd family of faith.

<u>Pledge 6</u>: **I will treasure church membership as a gift.** I am deeply aware that when I received the free gift of salvation through Christ, I became of a part of the Body of Christ. As such, I am not only obligated, but humbled and honored to serve God and others as a healthy member of the local church. I will pray that I will <u>never</u> take my church or membership in it for granted, but will always see it as an opportunity to serve and to be part of something greater than one person or one member.

Even if you were not present to fill out each pledge card, I encourage you to read those pledges again, and in prayer, and by the power of God, make each pledge, prayerfully seeking the Lord's power to keep them.






TAKING A BITE OUT OF HUNGER IN OUR COMMUNITY
