FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

SOME SUMMERTIME HAPPENINGS

Thus far this summer you might have noticed a few new faces with us on Sunday mornings. Those would be the faces of folks from St. Stephen's Anglican Church. Those parishioners and their rector, Fr. Jim Tomkins, began meeting with us in June. As a very small parish of the ACNA, they most recently were holding their Sunday worship in the chapel of a funeral home. We are blessed that they have decided to join us for worship and look forward to the day, God-willing, that they will formally join our family of faith as parishioners of Good Shepherd Church. This is indeed the plan that all involved are praying for this summer.

One of the things that St. Stephen's was doing is holding a weekly Bible study. That Bible study has continued here at Good Shepherd Church and is meeting each Thursday evening in the conference room beginning at 6:30 PM with coffee and dessert being served. I had the privilege of attending and enjoyed my time with them. Since then, unfortunately, my Thursday evenings are scheduled out to participate in a clergy book club with our bishop. The group continues to meet, however, and a few of our Good Shepherd folks have joined in. I highly encourage you to consider joining in as well. Fr. Jim leads the discussion each week and I think you will count it as a blessing to participate.

As I mentioned, as time moves us forward, we are praying that the parishioners of St. Stephen's will feel welcomed and comfortable with our church family and will deicide to formally become a part of us. This will not only allow us to welcome several new folks into our fold, but it gives Fr. Jim and chance to focus on a few other callings in his ministry. One of those that he and I are working jointly on is to start an Anglican Campus Ministry at the University of New Orleans. Fr. Jim is also discerning a new church plant on the north shore. Please keep all of these causes in your prayers.

As you pray for these causes, allow me to share a very exciting story with you. On Sunday, June 27, our 8:30 AM service had a first time visitor at it. After the service, I introduced myself to the young man and learned his name is Noah. As we briefly chatted, he informed me that he is a member of the Anglican Church in North America and recently relocated from Wisconsin to Slidell, LA for his job. As we chatted a bit more, he mentioned that he was involved in an ACNA church plant while in college, is discerning a call to the Anglican priesthood, and would be very open to helping start a church plant on the north shore where he lives. As I mentioned a moment ago, Fr. Jim is discerning his calling to plant an ACNA parish on the north shore.

This caused me to stop and one again contemplate the awesomeness of the God we serve—a God who is a provider and who provides exactly what we need, exactly when we need it.

As I write this, we are less than one week removed from the above story, so obviously, it's a bit too early to know what the ultimate outcome will be. But regardless of what comes of it, I personally am considering it as a beautiful blessing and affirmation from the Lord of the work we are trying to do through Good Shepherd Church.



PRAYING AN ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Since the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown began last year, Good Shepherd Church has been streaming our 10:00 AM Sunday morning Service of Holy Eucharist each week. During the distribution of Holy Communion, the lector reads a prayer entitled **An Act of Spiritual Communion** for those who are watching at home and are unable to partake in the reception of Holy Communion sacramentally. That beautiful prayer comes from the Book of Common Prayer (pg. 677, ACNA 2019) and can be prayed by a Christian any time they are longing for the grace of Holy Communion but are unable to receive the tangible elements of the sacrament. These are the words to that prayer:

Dear Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Holy Sacrament.

I love you above all things, and I desire to possess you within my soul.

And since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I beseech you to come spiritually into my heart.

I unite myself to you, together with all your faithful people gathered around every altar of your Church, and I embrace you with all the affections of my soul.

Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.
