FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

What's new for you in 2020? The New Year can be filled with the excitement of resolutions and the chance for a fresh start at doing things differently.

One thing Good Shepherd Church will be doing a little differently in 2020 is eliminating the sponsorship of flowers that adorn our Lord's Altar. Historically, the live flowers have been paid for by members wishing to honor the memory of a loved one or wishing to celebrate a special event such as a birthday or anniversary. Unfortunately, each year, some Sundays were not sponsored and a few Sundays that were pledged to be sponsored ended up inadvertently falling through cracks. When these things happen, the church has been left having to pick up the tab for the weekly floral arrangement.

Beginning in 2020, the GSC Altar Guild will experiment with the use of professionally arranged silk flowers. These arrangements will allow for a great diversity of color and beauty while providing the benefit of a one time cost for arrangements that can be used over and over again.

The ability to honor, remember, and celebrate people and events, however, will continue, but will no longer be associated with flowers.

A "Sunday Celebrations, Honors, and Remembrances" form is now available. By completing the brief form with the necessary information (e.g., John and Jane are celebrating 20 years of marriage on June 15 or Mike and Sue wish to honor the memory of Sue's mother, Pauline on what would have been her 100th birthday) and turning it in along with a small \$10 honorarium, you can be assured that the Sunday of your choosing includes the publication of your honor in our Sunday bulletin and prayerful remembrance during our Sunday service.

GSC DENOMINATIONAL TASK FORCE NEWS

Over the course of the last two years we have been studying where Good Shepherd Church fits in with other denominations in the 21st century of Christianity.

Our research into church history has caused us to focus on the Anglican Church of North America (ACNA). This denomination's core beliefs are identical to that of the historical German Evangelical Church. The English Anglican church and the German Evangelical church developed at the same time after the protestant reformation. This is why so much of the Order of Worship in our hymnal mimics the liturgy of the Anglican Church.

The Denomination Task Force recommends that Good Shepherd Church begin a period of fellowship with the ACNA. The members of the task force have all made ourselves available with our phone numbers in each Sunday's bulletin to answer questions.

It is not good for us to be independent. Leadership comes and goes but God's will never changes.

At our church's annual meeting on January 26th the congregation will vote on a formal proposal to pursue Fellowship status with the ACNA. This is not a vote to join the denomination, but is a declaration that we are interested. It's a time to for our congregation to learn more about the ACNA and for the ACNA to learn more about us and being in fellowship will allow the opportunity for GSC to get to know the ACNA better as well as for the ACNA to get to know us a little better.


As a reminder, a few parishioners have not yet picked up their 2020 giving envelopes. The remaining giving envelopes are arranged alphabetically in the narthex of the church.

2020 will be a year like all others, full of surprises, plans, work, and play.


As for the new decade, we can only imagine! Happy New Year to each of you!
